



CIVICS EDUCATION FOR ADULTS

PRESENTED BY THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT, CAMDEN VICINAGE

The United States District Court for the District of New Jersey, Camden Vicinage, in collaboration with the AFBNJ and Camden County Bar Foundation, will present the community education series Civics Education for Adults. Eight classes will be instructed by a federal or state judge, and an experienced attorney.

The series is being offered at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesdays beginning on October 8 and will run between 90 to 120 minutes.

Classes will be held at Camden County College's Rohrer Center in Cherry Hill, room 117.

The classes will cover the following:

The Government - October 8, 2025

The U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights, Judiciary Act of 1789, branches of government, separation of powers, and the role of judges.

The Courts - October 15 2025

The difference between State and Federal Courts, precedent, stare decisis, and rule of law.

Civil Law - October 22, 2025

Understanding employment law context, and discrimination cases.

The First Amendment - October 29, 2025

The First Amendment protects speech but it is not absolute; there are exceptions.

Immigration Law - November 5, 2025

History, key concepts, case studies, and pathways to citizenship.

Criminal Law - November 12, 2025

Exploring the Fourth, Fifth and Sixth amendments with cases and key principles.

Due Process – November 19, 2025

Equal protection under the law, equality, and the Fourteenth Amendment.

Voting Rights – December 3, 2025

Voting and the United States Constitution, voting under state law, Electoral College, gerrymandering, and reapportionment vs. redistricting.
