STIPULATION OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, STATE OF NEW MEXICO, AND STATE OF COLORADO REGARDING INVOICES; [PROPOSED] ORDER

The States of Texas, New Mexico, and Colorado (Compacting States) stipulate to submit the following [Proposed] Order herein, without the review and/or prior approval of intervening party the United States. The Compacting States do so in light of the current shutdown of the federal government. The Compacting States are informed that counsel for the United States cannot approve payment until the shutdown is concluded. The split of expenses within the [Proposed] Order is consistent with the prior agreement of the Compacting States and the United States.

Since there is no current indication of how long the shutdown will continue, the Compacting States submit this [Proposed] Order for the Special Master's current consideration in an effort to avoid delay relative to the subject Mediator invoice and respectfully request the Special Master's approval of the same.
